

More than **95 percent** of Ohio parents who accessed Early Intervention for their child reported they were better able to support their child in learning new things and gaining new skills.

Help Me Grow services help foster healthy relationships, experiences, and environments to support brain development, **80 percent** of which occurs before age three.

Pregnant women who participated in Home Visiting were 48 percent less likely to have a child with low birth weight.







Developmental Disabilities

Early Intervention supports families with children birth to age three who have developmental delays or disabilities so that they have the best possible start in life.

Early Intervention professionals work with a child's family to identify strengths and needs and address developmental concerns as early as possible. Services are provided where families live, play, and spend their day.

Early Intervention is available in every part of the state and to any eligible child, regardless of family income.







What is Home Visiting?





Home Visiting is a voluntary, homebased service offered at no cost to the family. Caring and professional home visitors connect families to information and resources that support the health of babies and the entire family.

Home Visiting support can improve pregnancy outcomes and help families prepare for a new baby. Even after the baby is born, Home Visiting can help families learn about feeding, sleep, and how to keep their new baby safe and thriving.
